

90-250.3. PRIVATE PROVIDER

A. General

This section provides information regarding the use of private providers to prove an individual's inability to perform the Work Project in the GR Program.

B. Policy

All GR applicants/recipients who claim inability to perform the work project shall provide verification of their inability. Acceptable verification is outlined in section [90-250.1](#). Clients may choose to have the County pay for the employability evaluation through the GREE process ([90-250.2](#)) or choose to use a private provider. The County will not pay for any expenses incurred through the private provider.

Only GREE providers may complete the GREE if the applicant/recipient wants the County to pay for the evaluation. CMS will not pay for these evaluations unless the provider is a GREE provider. An applicant/recipient who is a CMS beneficiary may state they want to go to their CMS provider for the evaluation. The worker must inform the applicant/recipient that if the CMS provider is not a GREE provider, they must go to a GREE provider for the County to pay for the evaluation.

C. Procedures

Applicants/recipients who choose to provide the employability evaluation through the private provider shall be given a CSF 24. The CSF 24 must be completed by an acceptable provider.

The table below shows how to treat the results of the evaluation.

If the CSF 24 indicates the applicant/recipient ...	Then the applicant/recipient will be ...
"Can do the Work Project" or "Can do Light Duty Work Project",	aided as AB, if otherwise eligible, and subject to job search and work project requirements. (See chapter 90-700).
"Cannot do the Work Project",	evaluated to determine if eligible under the UE or the IAP. (See chapter 90-700 and 90-800).
