

90-700.04. AB TIME LIMITS

A. General This section provides information regarding the time limits for Employable AB GR Assistance.

B. Policy All employable applicants/recipients will be offered an opportunity to attend JSS and/or JT. AB applicants/recipients and/or their spouses will be limited to receiving GR for three months in a 12-month period (TMP). See [G](#), below, for instructions regarding recipients that move to San Diego County from another county in California. For married couples where one spouse meets the definition of UE/IP/IAP, that spouse may continue to be aided as a single adult, if otherwise eligible, until he/she no longer meets the UE/IP/IAP definition. However, the time-expired spouse's non-exempt income will be considered available to the UE/IP/IAP spouse.

C. Determining the TMP and the POE The table below shows some examples for determining the TMP and the POE for AB recipients.

Ex.	Situation	TMP	POE
1	Applicant is granted AB assistance on January 15, 2007 and JT is assigned on the same date.	February 1, 2007 through January 31, 2008	Begins February 2007 for three months, either consecutive or separate. February is the first full month of aid.
2	Applicant is granted AB assistance on January 1, 2007 and JT is assigned on the same date.	January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007	Begins January 2007 for three months, either consecutive or separate. January is the first full month of aid.
3	Applicant is granted AB assistance on February 3, 2007 and JT is assigned on the same date.	April 1, 2007 through March 31, 2008	Begins April 2007 for three months, either consecutive or separate. April is the first full month of aid.
4	Applicant is granted AB assistance on January 2, 2007 and JT is assigned on the same date.	February 1, 2007 through January 31, 2008	Begins February 2007 for three months, either consecutive or separate. February is the first full month of aid.

Determining the TMP and the POE (continued)

Ex.	Situation	TMP	POE
5	Applicant is granted AB assistance on January 1, 2007 and JT is assigned on the same date. The case is discontinued February 28, 2007. The applicant reapplies on June 12, 2007, is determined eligible effective June 24, 2007, and JT is assigned the same date.	January 1, 2007 through December 31, 2007	January 2007, February 2007, and July 2007 during the TMP, since the recipient is eligible to receive three months, either consecutive or separate, during the TMP. June 2007 is disregarded since it is not a full month of aid.
6	Applicant is granted AB assistance on March 1, 2007 and a JT is assigned the same date. The case is discontinued on April 30, 2007. The applicant reapplies in February 2008, is determined eligible on March 5, 2008, and JT is assigned the same date.	1. March 1, 2007 through February 29, 2008.	March and April 2007, even though the case was open for only two months and the individual did not receive a third month of employable assistance during the first TMP.
		2. April 1, 2008 through March 31, 2009.	April 2008 for three months, either consecutive or separate, during the second TMP since the applicant was not determined eligible until March 5, 2008.
7	Applicant is granted AB assistance on March 1, 2007 and is assigned JT on the same date. The case is discontinued on April 30, 2007 and the applicant reapplies January 3, 2008, and is determined eligible on January 28, 2008.	1. March 1, 2007 through February 29, 2008.	1. March 2007, April 2007, and February 2008 since the recipient received three months of employable assistance during the TMP.
		2. March 1, 2008 through February 28, 2009.	2. March 2008 for three months, either consecutive or separate during the second TMP.

D. Reapplication Requirements

A reapplication for GR will be required when there is a break in aid.

E. Second TMP and POE Follow First TMP and POE

For situations where a second TMP and POE immediately follow the ending of both the first TMP and POE, a new application will not be required for the second TMP and POE. The CW 7 and continuing cooperation with Employable Program requirements will constitute the continuing eligibility determination.

F. Continuing Eligibility as UE/IP/IAP during TMP

When time limits are immediately followed or interrupted by a period of eligibility to UE, IP, or IAP, a reapplication is not required. Establishment of eligibility to UE, IP or IAP before the TMP and POE ends, continuing cooperation with UE, IP or IAP requirements, and the CW 7/QR 7 will constitute the continuing eligibility determination.

G. Time Limits from Other Counties

The table below shows how time limits from other counties are treated in San Diego County when the client moves from another California county. There is no impact to the TMP or Period of Eligibility (POE) when a client moves from another state.

If the other county has ...	Then the worker will ...
No time limit,	Aid the individual based on the GR AB Time Limit rules. A new 12-month period would start as of the application date in San Diego County.
3-month time limit,	Contact the county to determine: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• TMP (use the TMP established by the other county)• Number of months aided in the other county Aid the individual for the number of months remaining in their 3-month period of eligibility.
6- or 9-month time limit,	Contact the county to determine: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• TMP (use the TMP established by the other county)• Number of months aided in the other county Aid the individual for the number of months remaining in their period of eligibility up to our 3-month limit.
