Subject **HEALTH CARE REFORM (HCR) MEDI-CAL**

Effective January 1, 2014

Reference ACWDL #14-28

Purpose To inform staff of the following:

- Elimination of the deprivation requirement for the Medi-Cal program effective January 1, 2014.
- Pregnant women linkage to the Parent/ Caretaker Relative group and AFDC- MN group.
- Medi-Cal linkage for stepparents.
- Sneede vs. Kizer rules.

Background

Prior to January 1, 2014, individuals in families were required to have linkage through a deprived child in order to be eligible to the 1931b or AFDC-Medically Needy (MN) programs.

Deprivation was established through the absence, death, incapacity or unemployment/underemployment of at least one parent in the child's family.

Deprivation

Elimination of Effective January 1, 2014, linkage to the Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) Parent/Caretaker Relatives group and the AFDC-MN program is established by the parent/caretaker living with the child or children for whose care the parent/caretaker relative has primary responsibility. Children no longer need deprivation to be eligible for those groups if they are living with a parent/caretaker relative.

Definition of Children

Under the MAGI Parent/ Caretaker group, a child is defined as someone who is under the age of 18 unless he/she is 18 years old and a full-time student in a secondary school or equivalent level of vocational or technical training.

 Under AFDC-MN, a child is defined as a non-disabled individual who is under the age 21 or a disabled individual under the age of 18.

Note: The age requirements for linkage purposes to the MAGI Parent/ Caretaker Relative group may not correspond to the age definitions for the Children's groups or for household composition purposes.

Pregnant Women

For the Parent/ Caretaker Relative group, the unborn child provides linkage in the last trimester of pregnancy.

For the AFDC-MN program, the unborn provides linkage from conception.

Stepparents

Stepparents are now linked if there is a step-child in the household (HH) with the parent.

Sneede vs. Kizer

vs. Only applies to MN cases. A MAGI evaluation must be applied prior to a MN- Sneede evaluation.

Required Action

Staff must apply these changes at application, redetermination, when a change is reported, at fair hearing, at client's request or whenever a case is brought to the County's attention.

Automation Impact

Current CalWIN functionality does not support elimination of deprivation under the MN group. A bottom line override will need to be performed along with the MEDS online transaction (via 14-28 HHSA) to obtain the needed results.
